The North American Division of Education is happy to bring you the annual listing of the Professional Growth Books. Some of these books are written by non-Adventist authors and, therefore, may not fully reflect Seventh-day Adventist philosophy. However, we believe there is value in these books which have been selected to inspire, bring insight, and challenge your thinking.

To secure a Professional Growth Certificate for the 2007-2008 school year, you should read the five issues of the *Journal of Adventist Education*, at least one book from Group B, and at least four additional books from two or more other headings. Some books have been listed under two headings and will count for either group. One book of your choice which could be classified under of any these headings may be substituted for a book on this list.

GROUP A -- READERS' CHOICE

Schoolwide Discipline Plan Without the Loopholes, by Jim Fay. The Love and Logic Press, Inc, 2005, 101 pages.

Recommended by Beverly Boyer. Mrs. Boyer teaches first grade at Spencerville Academy in Spencerville, Maryland. In addition to her teaching she has served on committees at the local conference, union conference and North American Division levels.

Mrs. Boyer writes:

My principal said, "We need a new discipline plan at school."

I thought, "Oh no, here we go again. What will it be this time? More color codes, more trinkets or punishments and rewards? How about merits and de-merits or check marks and time-out at recess? A new poster to create?"

What a relief when I found this was NOT a new prescriptive discipline plan like so many others that have been tried at our school. What a pleasant surprise when I learned that the "Love and Logic" plan provides a philosophical perspective with lots of flexibility for creating the kind of school climate we all want. This book is short and concise, but offers all the essential aspects of a positive, logic-based discipline plan. It's effective for a single classroom or for an entire school. Even though it's short, the book packs in a sample plan for effective discipline; guidelines and a code of ethics for discipline; essential skills for teachers; and, a plan for helping parents understand your discipline at school. If you've read other "Love and Logic" books, you'll find this easy-to-read and a good review. If you haven't, you'll find this a refreshing change from other cookbook style approaches to school discipline and classroom management.

GROUP B – DEVOTIONAL AND SPIRITUAL GROWTH

The Cure for Soul Fatigue: Spiritual Healing for the Worn Out, Stressed Out, and Burned Out, by Karl Haffner. Pacific Press Publishing Association. 2001, 126 pages.

Overwork, anxiety, and just the continual stresses of living contribute to what Karl Haffner has labeled Soul Fatigue. We live in a world that pushes people into a way of life that often doesn't make sense. In *The Cure for Soul Fatigue* the author outlines what happens in our physical, emotional, and spiritual lives when we live with Soul Fatigue. Haffner has a way of presenting wisdom with humor and in a way that is easy to understand and apply to one's own life. In this short book which begins with "Dripping the Soul Dry" and ends with "Living Above the Drip," Haffner brings the reader scripture and illustrations which can change his life.

Let your Light so Shine, by Jan Paulsen. Pacific Press Publishing Association, 2003, 128 pages.

In the preface Dr. Paulsen writes, "If you are looking for a 'learned book' or a book of theology, this is not it." If you are looking for a book that speaks to your heart, that offers you encouragement in your spiritual journey, that talks with you about the everyday joys and trials of living a life in relationship with Christ, this **is** it. Most of the dozen chapters in *Let your Light so Shine* began as sermons but were rewritten to speak to the reader. The book has to do with relationships and practical faith and is like a visit from a pastor, as in fact it is. Reading ***Let your Light so Shine*** is an opportunity to become acquainted with "the head pastor" of the Seventh-day Adventist Church.

Prayer: Does It Make any Difference? by Philip Yancey. Zondervan, 2006, 351 pages.

In the title of his book, *Prayer: Does It Make any Difference?* Philip Yancey asks a question that has crossed the mind of many Christians. While most Christians rate prayer as high in importance, many express questions about and dissatisfaction with their prayer life. In preparation for writing this book Yancey interviewed many people on the subject of prayer, read widely and thought deeply about this essential communication with the Creator. He discusses such questions as: Is God listening? Why should God care about me? Does prayer really help with physical healing? Why does God sometimes seem close and sometimes so far away? Does prayer change God or me? And how can I make prayer more satisfying? While the author does not pretend to have all the answers, he says he is a pilgrim on the subject of prayer, the reader will gain in understanding of prayer, our conversation with our Maker.

GROUP C --SPIRIT OF PROPHECY AND DENOMINATIONAL HISTORY

The Ministry of Health and Healing: An Adaption of the Ministry of Healing, by Ellen G. White. Pacific Press Publishing Association, 2004, 303 pages.

In this adaptation none of the truths or messages of *The Ministry of Healing* have been changed. However, the language has been made gender-inclusive, words with current meaning have been substituted for words that today may be misunderstood or have little meaning, and some sentence structure has been modified. The result is a book that is more readable for the people of today.

They Were There: Stories of Those Who Witnessed Ellen White's Prophetic Gift – and Believed, Compiled and Written by Herbert E. Douglas. Pacific Press Publishing Association, 2005, 128 pages.

Soft-cover List Price \$11.99

Toward the end of her life Ellen White urged that the stories recounting God's leading in the early advent movement be preserved. Herbert Douglas has written of the experiences of Ellen White and the impact these experiences had on the beginning and growth of the Seventh-day Adventist church. The first part of the book is about the impact of messages sent by God through Ellen White on individuals. The second part of the book tells of interventions that kept the denomination on course. Some of the stories may be familiar to the reader but other will be new. Chapters having such intriguing titles as "Egg in Grape Juice – Saving Dr. Daniel Kress," "'No Business in the Desk' – The Bigamist Preacher," and "Two Ladies Buy a Sanitarium – Origin of Paradise Valley Sanitarium" are included.

GROUP D--BACKGROUND FOR TEACHING

BIBLE

100 Quick and Easy Worship Ideas for Kids, by Karen Holford. Pacific Press Publishing Association, 2004, 143 pages.

Soft-cover List Price \$11.99

Although *100 Quick and Easy Worship Ideas for Kids* is written for parents, the ideas suggested are equally valid for use in the classroom. The content is most appropriate for the lower grade child. Each idea begins with a theme such as, "God's Ways Are Best for Us," or "God Made the Animals." One or more Bible stories which supports the theme is suggested, materials for activities are listed, activities are described, and other options are provided. The teacher will find *100 Quick and Easy Worship Ideas for Kids* an easy source of ideas for classroom worship.

Brad, Visionary Spiritual Leadership, by Harold E. Lee with Monte Sahlin. Bradford- Cleveland Institute and Center for Creative Ministries, 2005, 259 pages.

Brad, Visionary Spiritual Leadership is partly biographical, partly theological, and partly about issues in the church. The book deals with the leadership style of a great leader based on information from interviews, letters, published and unpublished papers. Charles Bradford was not only an outstanding leader, a great preacher and evangelist but a pastor who was attuned to the needs and ideas of the people with whom he worked. His faithfulness to God, his concern for the people in the pew and those who worked with him, defined his success as a minister and administrator. Elder Bradford was the first Black president of the North American Division at the time North America was moving from “a special relationship” with the General Conference to a division more in line with the other world divisions.

Mark: the Gospel of Jesus, by William Johnson. Review and Herald Publishing Association, 205, 144 pages.

Mark: the Gospel of Jesus is an in-depth study of the book of *Mark* which is usually considered to be the first of the four Gospels written. After discussing why the book of *Mark*, as well as the other three Gospels, can be trusted, Dr. Johnson compares the four Gospels – their focus and perspective. An examination of the text, passage by passage, throughout the book of *Mark* follows the more general discussion with which *Mark: the Gospel of Jesus*, begins. The reader will find this book valuable for personal study as well as giving background for teaching about Christ’s life.

American Gospel: God, the Founding Fathers, and the Making of a Nation (See Group H)

HISTORY

The Americanization of Benjamin Franklin, by Gordon S. Wood. Penguin Books, 2004, 299 pages.

Gordon S. Wood, a Pulitzer prize winner, has written a biography which raises Benjamin Franklin out of the mythology with which most Americans view him. *The Americanization of Benjamin Franklin* “penetrates beneath the images and representations of Franklin that have accumulated over the past 200 hundred years . . .” It was the author’s intent to present the “historical” Franklin, the man as he was known in his lifetime. This book has been described as brilliant, engaging and a landmark book by reviewers.

The Americanization of Benjamin Franklin is not a book just for the history teacher. The interest of the reader will be held from the first page as new insights and a deeper understanding of the eighteenth century are presented and documented. Wood addresses such questions as why Franklin was distrusted by both the Americans and the British shortly before the Revolution, what was Franklin’s quarrel with the family of William Penn, and what were his invaluable contributions during and after the Revolutionary War.

Mayflower: a Story of Courage, Community, and War, by Nathaniel Philbrick. Viking, 2006, 443 pages.

The story of the Mayflower, the Pilgrims and the first Thanksgiving is one of the most familiar bits of history to teachers and students alike. Nathaniel Philbrick has written about that time in American history in a way that will bring to life the people and events of this early New England settlement. That the settlement ever survived those first years is a miracle in itself. One gets the picture of a few men wandering around in a strange and unfriendly place – far north of their original destination – searching for somewhere to build a colony, while the families waited sick and dying aboard the ship. The first winter, without enough food or shelter, with members of the colony dying in such numbers they were buried in secret so the natives would not know how few remained, with contacts with the Native Americans few and unsatisfactory, the Pilgrims endured that time with fortitude and faith.

Mayflower: a Story of Courage, Community, and War is a fascinating and informative book. The reader will meet familiar names such as William Bradford, Edward Winslow, Miles Standish (who was barely five feet tall), Massasoit and Squanto (who was not trusted by either the settlers or the Native Americans). The reader will find it hard to put down Philbrick’s fascinating account of the first fifty-five years of the drama that shaped New England for years to come.

LANGUAGE AND READING

The Multiple Intelligences of Reading and Writing, by Thomas Armstrong. Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development (ASCD), 2003, 152 pages.

The Multiple Intelligences of Reading and Writing begins with a summary of MI (Multiple Intelligence Theory) discussing its implications for teaching reading and writing. Because neurologically each person is organized differently, we learn in different ways. In harmony with this belief the theory supports a multiple focus to teaching literacy.

In each chapter, beginning with chapter two, Armstrong discusses a different intelligence as it relates to reading and writing. The largest part of each chapter, however, is given to practical teaching strategies that involve the use of the intelligence discussed. *The Multiple Intelligences of Reading and Writing* is a practical book that will offer new strategies for the teacher who would like to reach each child regardless of the child’s learning style.

MATHEMATICS

Euclid’s Window: the Story of Geometry from Parallel Lines to Hyperspace, by Leonard Mlodinow. Touchstone (Simon and Schuster), 2001, 306 pages.

Euclid's Window is a book about the five revolutions of geometry told by a scientist turned story teller. The author writes with clarity and humor telling not only of the development in geometry from the Egyptians to string theory but also the story of the men and women whose ideas have brought us to the place we are today.

Euclid, whose name is so strongly associated with geometry, possibly did not discover even one significant law of geometry. Why then is he so famous? Why was a beautiful woman dragged from her carriage and murdered? What is her association with perhaps the greatest library that ever existed and the end of civilization at that time? For what is Newton famous in addition to watching falling apples? *Euclid's Window* deals not only with the history of geometry, "earth measurement," but the story of ideas and the people who had them. It is both an informative and entertaining book.

Mathematics Minus Fear: All You Ever Wanted to Know about Mathematics and Were Afraid to Ask, by Lawrence Potter. Marion Boyers, 2006, 287 pages.

Mathematics Minus Fear: All You Ever Wanted to Know about Mathematics and Were Afraid to Ask is an informative and entertaining book written in a light-hearted and humorous style. The book ranges from simple arithmetic to algebra and laws of probability. The author touches on number systems, interesting algorithms for solving problems, the reasoning behind why we follow the procedures used in solving problems, algebra, ratio and proportion. Strange and interesting bits of history of mathematics are included. Scattered throughout the book are 82 mathematical puzzles to interest the reader as well as his students. *Mathematics Minus Fear* is recommended for the teacher who would like to add interest to classroom instruction.

SCIENCE

Last Child in the Woods, Saving our Children from Nature-Deficit Disorder, by Richard Louv. Algonquin Books of Chapel Hill 2005, 320 pages.

Today's child is experiencing fewer and fewer contacts with the natural world. While years ago children roamed the fields, climbed trees, built forts and tree houses, children today spend more and more time on asphalt playgrounds, in front of the computer, in organized sports and in watching television. "This book explores the increasing divide between the young and the natural world, and environmental, social, psychological and spiritual implications of the change." The author explores the causes of the change and suggests what the parents, and teachers, can do to avoid nature-deprivation. The writer cites examples of the benefit of nature to children with ADD disorders as well as the need of all children to spend time in a natural outdoor environment.

Richard Louv has been a columnist and member of the advisory board for Parent's Magazine. He

has written articles for magazines and papers including the Washington Post and the New York Times as well as a several books about children.

The Complete Idiots Guide to Science Fair Projects, by Nancy K. O'Leary and Susan Shelley. Alpha , 2003, 343 pages.

Science projects for Science Fairs have been a part of the American educational scene for a number of years. Yet every year complaints and frustration about planning a fair and indecision about choosing a topic are common. *The Complete Idiots Guide to Science Fair Projects* is a resource for teachers and students faced with the yearly decision about what to do for the Science Fair. Part 1 includes choosing a topic, understanding the scientific method, and collecting data and making observations. Parts 2, 3, 4, and 5 give examples of projects at levels ranging from beginners to advanced. Part 6 discusses how results can be displayed and the process of making reports.

In addition to the very readable and practical information in each section, four types of sidebars are included: "Standard Procedures" (Additional tips to help with the project.), "Scientific Lingo", (Tips on understanding scientific language.), "Explosion Ahead", (Warnings that help you avoid disaster.), and "Scientific Surprise", (Interesting little facts about science.)

GROUP E --TEACHERS' PERSONAL GROWTH

Telling the Truth to Yourself, by William Backus and Marie Chapien. Bethany House Publishers, 2000, 220 pages.

Telling the Truth to Yourself is about the way people handle problems and emotions in their lives. The authors explain and illustrate what they call Misbelief Therapy, a concept that is based on Biblical principles of handling depression, anger, anxiety, lack of self-control, self-hate, fear of change, fear of taking a chance, and relationships. The misbeliefs we harbor in our lives and the destructive self-talk that grows out of them cause us many problems and much unhappiness. The writers include examples of people who were miserable because of their misbeliefs and relate how changing their thinking and self-talk enabled them to live happier, more productive lives. Biblical texts supporting the ideas presented and are included throughout the text and at the end of each chapter. A Study Guide is provided at the end of the book.

Watching the World Change: The Stories Behind the Images of 9/11, by David Friend. Farrar Straus and Giroux, 2006, 435 pages.

The events of September 11, 2001 were recorded by camera and viewed around the world as no other event in history. From professional photographers to people using disposable cameras, the tragedy of that day was recorded in such detail that we literally watched the world change. It was as if the horror of the event had to be recorded in pictures or we could not believe it was taking place. Across the world watchers were glued to their televisions as the images of the planes hitting the twin towers, the towers falling, and the faces of the people fleeing the scene were played over and over. David Friend, Vanity Fair's editor for creative development, tells the stories behind the pictures taken on September 11 and each day of the following week. *Watching the World Change* is a unique and powerful account of those days and the people who lived through them.

GROUP F -- TEACHING AND LEARNING

The Complete Idiots Guide to Success as a Teacher, by Anthony Fredericks. Alpha, 2005, 344 pages.

The Complete Idiots Guide to Success as a Teacher is a desk-top reference book that addresses everything from greeting students as they enter the classroom to homework -- how much and what kind. Unlike a methods book *The Complete Idiots Guide to Successful Teaching* avoids long-winded explanations and dull theories. The writer states that he wrote the book because there was a need for "one concise, down-to-earth, **practical** guide to successful teaching." The experienced teacher will find this book helpful as will the beginning teacher.

The Complete Idiots Guide to Success as a Teacher is designed to be user friendly. In addition to a detailed table of contents and a comprehensive index there are side bars to call attention to important points. They include "It's Elementary" (practical ideas for the elementary teacher), "Secondary Thoughts" (thoughts and perspectives for the secondary teacher), "Fire Alarm" (things that you need to watch out for), "Expert Opinion" (tips, ideas and stories collected from teachers), and "Jabberwocky" (terminology and vocabulary used in teaching). This may be a book you will want to buy to keep as a reference.

Totally Positive Teaching: A Five-Stage Approach to Energizing Students and Teachers, by Joseph Ciaccio. ASCD, 2004, 185 pages.

The author clearly states that, "The purpose of this book is to give educators ideas that can help them become superior teachers and principals, and, at the same time, happier in their chosen profession." He organizes the book around five techniques each of which is developed in a separate chapter. The techniques include: (1) meeting mutual needs, (2) changing counterproductive feelings, (3) ending behavior problems, (4) helping underachievers, and (5) using active learning strategies. As suggested by the title, *Totally Positive Teaching*, emphasizes changing the negative ways in which teachers often think and relate to troublesome students and problem teaching situations. Ciaccio contends that superior results occur when the teacher is

happier and a positive approach is used.

The title, *Totally Positive Teaching*, may sound a bit idealistic, but in fact the book is practical and helpful in dealing with parents and students. Ciaccio says his first ten years of teaching he was miserable and he realized he needed to change his approach or face burnout. *Totally Positive Teaching* is rich in anecdotes, examples, and illustrations based on the experiences of many teachers. An excellent book for teachers at all levels.

The Immortality of Influence, by Salome Thomas-El with Cecil Murphey. Kensington Publishing Association, 2006, 291 pages.

Based on his twenty years as a teacher and administrator in the Philadelphia School District, Salome Thomas-El discusses the many positive and negative influences on a student's life. Teachers and parents, Thomas-El points out, often do not recognize the far-reaching and long-lasting effects of their influence. The author has helped under-privileged students toward achieving their full potential. In order to reach his goals, he has started programs such as teaching students to play chess and Saturday school. Many students' experiences, both in the classroom and reaching beyond the classroom are included. The book begins with a chapter entitled "Failed Influence," which relates Thomas-El's experience with one boy whose life ended when he was murdered on a street corner. The influence of parents, health, discipline, respect and faith are among the topics discussed.

GROUP G – UNDERSTANDING STUDENTS

Stressed-out Girls: Helping Them Thrive in the Age of Pressure, by Roni Cohnen-Sandler. Penguin Books, 2005, 274 pages.

According to a study of some 3000 girls, psychiatrist Roni Cohen-Sandler states that today girls are experiencing debilitating stress that threatens their health, ability to succeed and overall well being. Based on his interviews with the girls in his study, as well as patients brought to his office, the author has identified that the stress found in girls from middle-schools and high schools results from the increasing expectations and pressures placed on girls by parents and schools. Part one of *Stressed-out Girls* gives insight into what causes this stress which even extends down into the elementary school. Part two identifies girls who are especially at risk and Part Three gives teachers and parents tools to deal with unacceptable stress.

Although the author acknowledges that boys too are under stress, he identifies reasons why girls seem more prone to this problem. However, many of the causes and the techniques given can apply to boys who exhibit symptoms of stress,

The Angry Child: Regaining Control When Your Child Is out of Control, Tim Murphey and Loriann Hoff Oberlin. Three Rivers Press, 2001, 255 pages.

The Angry Child: Regaining Control When Your Child Is out of Control is written for parents but is equally valid for teachers and administrators at all levels. Teachers as well as parents must deal with angry children. From the first grader through college students bring their anger and depression to school with them. All children get angry but there is a difference between getting angry and constant anger. *The Angry Child: Regaining Control When Your Child Is out of Control* discusses the ten characteristics of the angry child, the four stages of anger and strategies for dealing with anger. It discusses the source of anger from family problems to the role of violence in the media. The information in this book will help teachers as well as parents determine when the child may need professional help.

GROUP H – ISSUES

***The Flickering Mind: Saving Education from the False Promise of Technology* By Todd Oppenheimer. Random House Trade Books, 2004, 493 pages.**

Todd Oppenheimer is not an educator but rather an investigative reporter who has written a comprehensive and important book on education. The title alone implies that this is a controversial book since it suggests that not only in the past but in the current days of computers, technology has not fulfilled its promise to provide the best in education. Oppenheimer visited dozens of schools, mostly public, consulted with experts, and read volumes of studies on which he bases his opinions. You may not agree with all of his opinions but you owe it to yourself to consider the material the author presents.

***American Gospel: God, the Founding Fathers, and the Making of a Nation*, by Jon Meacham. Random House, 2006, 399 pages.**

In *American Gospel: God, the Founding Fathers, and the Making of a Nation*, Jon Meacham tells the story of the how the founders of America “viewed faith and how they ultimately created a nation in which a belief in God is a matter of choice,” From Jon Winthrop’s “city on a hill” speech to the singing of “God Bless America” by the members of congress on the steps of the Capital on September 11, 2001, Meacham traces the role of religion in the history of America. This book is listed under the heading of Issues because of the controversy surrounding the role of religion in the United States, with the Religious Right taking one position and the extreme secularists taking the other. Meacham contends the separation of church and state as practiced in America is not a solid wall but rather a blurred hedge. A barrier which permits congress to be opened by prayer, “In God We Trust” to be placed on our money and presidents to be sworn into office with their hand on a Bible. He discusses Benjamin Franklin’s concept of “Public Religion” as practiced in America which helps us in keeping a balance between establishing a religion as prohibited by the constitution and expelling all reference to God from our government.

American Gospel: God, the Founding Fathers, and the Making of a Nation, is a fascinating and

informative book. Appendix A includes selected documents on religion in America. Appendix B contains Bible verses chosen by different presidents for the swearing in ceremony at their inauguration. The book is well documented and provides an extensive bibliography.
