Contest Guidelines

There are 3 categories of entries: K-4, 5-8, and 9-12. Prizes will be awarded for first, second, and third place entries in each category. Prizes are described below, with matching dollar amounts to be awarded to the winning students' classrooms to be used for classroom resources. The contest submission form must accompany each entry. Entries can be submitted by mail, fax, or email, and must be received by **June 1, 2012**.
